

## **RIFFIAN PEACE ENVOY REPORTED AT RABAT**

***But Official Confirmation Is Lack-  
ing—Lightning Strikes Abd-el-  
Krim's Headquarters.***

**RABAT, Morocco, March 31.**—It is reported that Caïd Haduu Lekhal, one of Abd-el-Krim's closest counsellors, is now at Rabat, the capital of French Morocco, with the object of entering into peace negotiations with High Commissioner Steeg when he returns from Paris. Official confirmation is unobtainable.

Natives from the Riff assert that Abd-el-Krim's headquarters were recently struck by lightning, causing a panic to many who believed it presaged coming disasters.

## **LEFT \$1,000,000 TO WIFE.**

**Julius Kruttschnitt Estate Is Ap-  
praised at \$1,168,350.**

Julius Kruttschnitt, late Chairman of the Board of the Southern Pacific Railway, left an estate appraised yesterday at \$1,168,350, of which only \$497,415 is taxable in New York. He gave more than \$1,000,000 to his wife, E. Minna Kruttschnitt, and \$25,000 each of his sons John and Julius. In leaving only \$5,000 to his son Lieut. Col. Theodore H. Kruttschnitt he said it was because he had to pay large amounts for him during his lifetime. His daughter, Mrs. Rebecca K. Woodhouse, got \$10,000 in addition to a trust fund of \$80,000 set aside for her benefit.

Mr. Kruttschnitt's largest holdings were 720 shares National Bank of Commerce, worth \$278,480; 520 shares United States Mortgage and Trust Company, \$182,000; 4,000 Pacific Oil, \$237,000; 433 Central Trust Company, \$114,345, and 349 Continental and Commercial National Bank, \$122,673. He lived in New Canaan, Conn., where he died on June 15 last.
