ABD-EL KRIM GOES TO EXILE.

FEZ, Morocco, Aug. 27.-Mournful, ill, yet patient with the characteristic Moslem fatalism, Abd-el Krim today boarded a special train here for Casablanca, where he will embark tomorrow for perpetual exile on Reunion Island. With him were his brother and War Minister, Si Mohamed Ben Abd-el Krim: his secretary, Abd-el Essem Ben Mohamed, their wives and children, a military doctor and armed guards. In all twenty-four Moroccans comprise the exiled family.

As Abd-el Krim leaves the soil where his exploits brought 250,000 white men to maintain the French and Spanish protectorates and the Sultan's sovereignty, European armies are still battling against the remaining dissidents between Quezzan and Cechhouain. The French in two days have succeeded in regaining sixty square kilometers of territory without loss, and with the Spanish on their left are erasing the rebel zone blocking the mountain passes to Cechhouain from the west.
